### Coffin of Pedi-Osiris

Unknown Egyptian

Egyptian, Ptolemaic period, 332-30 BC

Carved and painted wood; gold leaf: 86 1/8 x 26 x 18 in. (218.8 x 66.0 x 45.7 cm)

Ancient Egyptian religion believed in life after death. This is the coffin of Pedi-Osiris, a priest of Osiris, Lord of the Underworld. Standing over seven feet, the coffin once held the mummified body that had been elaborately prepared and wrapped in multiple layers of linen cloth.

Pedi-Osiris appears with a gold face, exotic black-lined eyes, a fake beard (a symbol of high rank), wig painted the rich blue of lapis lazuli, numerous painted necklaces, and red clothing covered with a net of painted beads. Many gods and goddesses of ancient Egypt appear on the coffin. They protected the deceased and helped him to achieve life in the next world.
